Submission

Formatting and presentation requirements

For the two major assessment items the following file formats will be accepted:

- Microsoft Word (.doc or .docx)
- Rich Text Format (.rtf)
- Open Document File Format (.odt, e.g. produced by Open Office Writer).

Assignments are required, so far as is practicable, to be formatted in accordance with the APA Publication Manual (APA, 2010). This includes document structure, page layout, headings, grammar, style and, of course, referencing. However, it should be noted that APA requirements are designed for documents intended to be published in psychology journals. Some aspects of student assignments are necessarily a little different but for the most part, it is possible to adhere to APA requirements.

General requirements

- There is a tolerance of +/- 10%.
- Professional structure which includes a Title page, introduction and conclusion.
- Appendices, diagrams, direct quotes, face page, figures, page numbers, reference list, and tables are not included in the word count. Headings and in-text citations are counted.
- Use Arial or Times New Roman 12 point font with double line spacing
- Uniform margins of 1 inch (2.54 cm) on all sides (this is the default "Normal" margin setup in Word)
- Pages are numbered

Research and Referencing

You are required to use the APA referencing system, details of which are available on the USQ Library website. Do not reference the study modules, lecture notes etc. You may reference the textbook, readings etc.

Appendices

Appendices can be useful for detailed information that does not fit with the normal flow of the text in the body of your assignment. *You may use appendices in your Community Development Plan.* Appendices should be placed after the reference list and labelled Appendix A, Appendix B etc., together with an appropriate title. Each Appendix starts on a new page. Each appendix must be referred to with the main text of the document.
